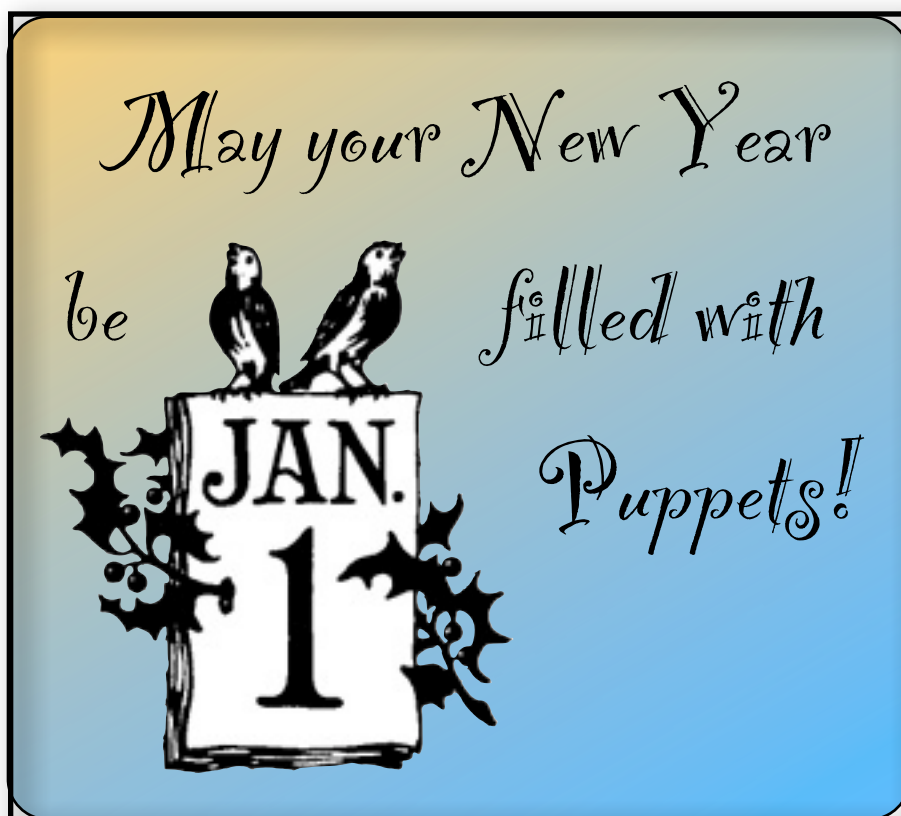

GUILD LIBRARY

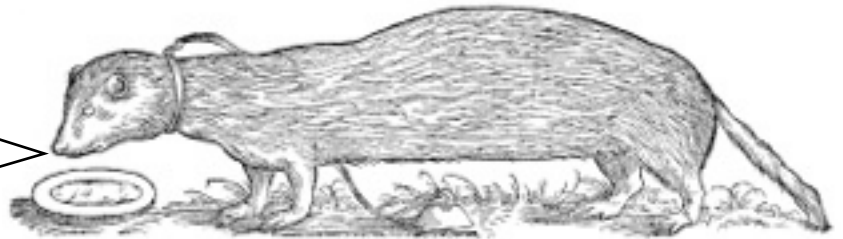

GRAND OPENING...

Guild members Conrad Bishop & Elizabeth Fuller announce a new show opening the second week of January. It'll be at California Pacific Medical Center in San Francisco, featuring Dr. Vincent Gaudiani repairing the damaged mitral valve of Conrad's heart. No puppetry here, unless the valve requires replacement rather than repair. Sorry: the public may not attend, but a vivid post-op narrative will be supplied by the recipient.

Initial symptoms forced postponement of The Independent Eye's new show, GIFTS, which will be rescheduled for some time in March or April, but proved to be a godsend, as there were no previous indications of heart damage. Conrad emphatically does not look forward to having his chest whacked open, but takes comfort in the fact that survival rate for this particular operation is 98% - that's much better than the odds of surviving in independent theatre.

NATIONAL PUPPETRY FESTIVAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Thanks to the generous support of fellow Puppeteers of America members, Youth, Young Adult, and Adult scholarships are available for the Puppeteers of America National Festival -Puppet Festival (r)Evolution 2013 - at Swarthmore College near Philadelphia, PA ,August 5th - 10th, 2013.

Scholarships cover registration fees for the festival and are awarded to three age groups.

- Youth - ages 12-17
- Young Adults ages 18-21
- Adults age 22 and older



Selection is based on a completed application which demonstrates one's involvement in puppetry (current and future), financial need, energy/passion and enthusiasm for puppetry along with support materials and letters of recommendation. Every applicant must be a current member of the Puppeteers of America or be sponsored by a member organization in order to apply.

Deadline for submission of completed applications, letters of recommendation and support material is February 1, 2013.

There's an App For That...

Storyboarding. It's something I don't always do when developing a new show, but have always found it useful when I did. While I have drawing apps on my iPad, I've yet to use them to produce a show. Here is an excerpted review of an app that might fit the bill.

Updated 'Paper' iOS App Makes Storyboarding on the iPad Even Easier

An Apple Design Award winning iPad app that I reviewed back in March, Paper, has received a major update that makes the drawing program even easier to use. The latest update has put the emphasis on organization, and it's clear that the team at FiftyThree are dedicated to making the app as simple, functional, and powerful as possible.

While it is not a storyboarding app per se, it definitely makes it possible to create very professional looking results — even for those of us who aren't gifted when it comes to drawing.

There is a reason that Paper won a design award, and that is because it truly utilizes the touch interface in a way that not only makes sense, but actually makes it faster to work.

The social media integration also makes it really easy for a group of people to share drawings over something like a Tumblr account. The app could also be beneficial for a director/DP relationship, because even the worst artists can come up with passable results with Paper. I would like to see true storyboard features with the app, but for now, it could definitely do the job for many projects as is.

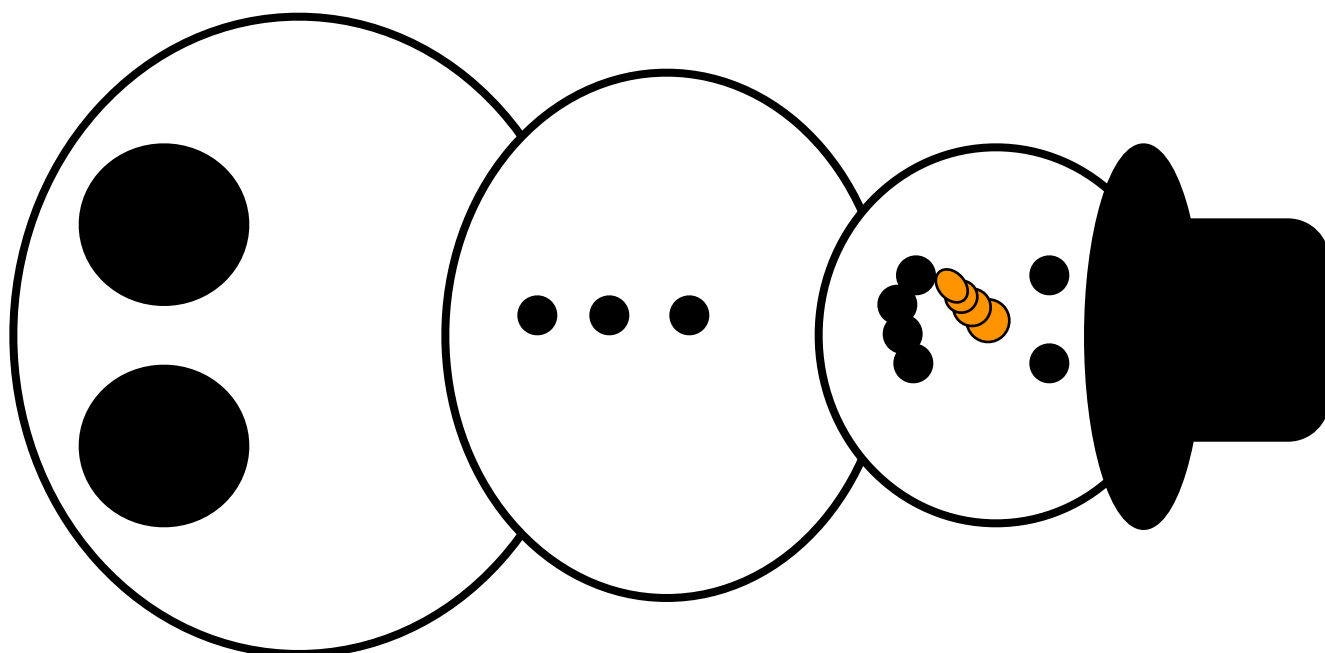
